The 398-bed, 201-unit building will provide Emory's graduate and professional students with a well-located, luxury product and will provide a much-needed venue for graduate housing.

"This solution will improve the university's graduate housing situation while meeting our goals of quality, sustainability and affordability," explained Daniel Bernstein, senior vice president and chief investment officer of Campus Apartments.
